QUALIFICATIONS

Scottish BE100 Championship

Any eligible combination placed first to third* in a BE100 or BE100 Open section in Scotland between 1st July 2018 and 16th July 2019 is qualified to compete at the Scottish BE100 Championship 2019. The number of combinations which qualify may be adjusted at the request of the Chief Executive.

All eligible Horses must be Grade 4 at the ballot date of the event at which they qualify for the Scottish BE100 Championship. Horses may have won a maximum of seven grading points between the ballot date of the event at which they qualify and the date of the Championship.

Riders must not have completed an Intermediate or higher-level competition during the current or preceding five calendar seasons.

Scottish BE90 Championship

Any combination placed first to third* in a BE90 section in Scotland between 1st July 2018 and 16th July 2019 is qualified to compete at the Scottish BE90 Championship 2019. The number of combinations which qualify may be adjusted at the request of the Chief Executive.

All eligible Horses must be Grade 4 at the date of the Scottish BE90 Championship. Horses may have won a maximum of seven grading points between the ballot date of the event at which they qualify and the date of the Championship.

Riders must not have completed an Intermediate or higher-level competition during the current or preceding five calendar seasons.

STABLING

Horses may use the overnight stabling provided which will be available from 4pm on Thursday 22 August until Sunday 25 August. Stable numbers are limited and booking is on a first-come, first-served basis. Friday/Saturday only stables may also be available.

Single night stabling is £60 VAT included.

Duration stabling (from Thursday to Sunday included) is £140 VAT included.

Straw is included free of charge. Shavings and hay/haylage may be purchased on site.

PRIZES

Horse rug to the winner of the BE90 and BE100 championship.

Rosettes to 12th place in each class. A completion rosette will be presented to the rider of each horse that completes the competition (13th place onwards)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The courses have been designed to incorporate flatter areas of the parkland and will run entirely in the bottom park. The tracks run over free-draining parkland turf which will be equivated if necessary. The tracks are well built and presented with a mixture of permanent and portable obstacles.

ACCOMMODATION/CATERING

CAMPING - Only competitors who have booked stables are permitted to stay overnight in their horseboxes. Competitors who have not booked stabling must leave the showground at the end of the show day. Horses may not be kept in horseboxes overnight. Pens are not permitted overnight or during the day. Anyone erecting pens will be asked to take them down.

There is limited competitor camping permitted in the Lorry Park. Competitors requiring an additional pass for a car and caravan must request one in advance from the Horse Trials Office, on a first come first served basis. Caravans or cars without the correct pass will be redirected to Car Park 1 or the Event campsite, where they will be required to purchase parking or pitch rental.

HOSPITALITY – There will be a marquee overlooking the Main Arena dedicated to riders and owners open from 8.45 am to 5.30 pm Thursday – Sunday where complimentary tea and coffee will be served.

CATERING – The public catering marquee is open for food from 7.00am to 9.00pm Wednesday to Sunday. The bar will be open 11.00am to midnight Thursday to Sunday. Additional catering units will also be available around the venue.

LOCATION

Blair Castle and Atholl Estates are easily accessible, just 2m off the main A9 road through Scotland. Access to the Event is well signposted from the A9, approximately 30m north of Perth.

ACCREDITATION

The riders pack with your wristbands, bib number and bridle number will be available for collection on site, in the Information Tent from Tuesday afternoon.

3 wristbands for entry. The wristbands will give access to the event, to the stables and to the Owners Tent from Thursday - Sunday included.

Upgrade to Membership is available onsite for the discounted price of £20 per person. (Subject to availability).

1 Lorry pass will be issued per entry form and will be posted with access related to stabling booking;

1 Car Pass will be issued per entry form and will be posted for access Wednesday - Sunday included.

All Owners and riders will be invited (invitation only) to the Drinks reception in the Castle on Wednesday evening.

All further admission passes and vehicle passes must be booked and paid for through our online box office. Camping in the lorry park is limited and will be allocated on a first-come, first-serve basis at the organiser's discretion.

STABLING

Applications open on the 16th July 2019; applications received prior to this date will NOT be accepted. Bookings close 9th August 2019, or when all stables are filled.

Strictly NO applications will be accepted after this date. No refunds will be given for stabling cancelled after the closing date. Stabling applications will NOT be accepted without payment. Competitors are not permitted to sublet stables.

Straw is supplied for bedding; competitors requiring shavings are welcome to bring their own or purchase them at the event. Hay is not supplied but can be purchased at the event.

Boxes will be available from 4pm on the day of arrival. Boxes MUST BE vacated and mucked out by 2pm on the day of departure.

1. **DOGS:** Dogs must be kept on leads and under control at all times. Owners must clean up after their dogs. Loose dogs and fouling will incur a £10 fine which will be donated to the Event Official Charity.
2. **DOPE TEST:** The Committee reserves the right to have any animal tested.
3. **LIABILITY:** Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers, Atholl Estates, Blair Castle Estate Ltd, nor any Agent, employee or representative of these bodies accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury, illness to horses, riders, owners, grooms, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.
4. **INSURANCES:** All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy up to date.
5. **LOSS OR DAMAGE:** The organisers accept no responsibility whatsoever for loss, injury or damage, however caused, to any person, animal or property of the Showground, in stables or in car park.
6. **CHILDREN:** Children under the age of 16 must be supervised by an adult while riding/handling horses or ponies, with the exception of while competing in a class.
7. **CURFEW:** There is a curfew on riding of 7pm throughout the event. This includes warm up arenas and hacking as well as competition arenas. Horses may still be exercised in hand or lunged after this time. Anyone found riding after curfew may be asked to leave the venue. No refunds will be given for stabling or entry fees.
8. **GENERAL** The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry without stating a reason and alter or cancel any published classes.
